



## Thailand on Lockdown



Over the month of April our province of Chiang Mai (in the northwest corner of Thailand) has had a big upswing of Covid cases. Since vaccines are not available to the general public here, our little corner of the world is starting to experience a lot of anxiety and lockdown measures are in place. This means that we can't gather in groups of 10 or more, so even dinners and house church have been cancelled. Compared to other countries Thailand has had very few cases of Covid until recently, so the third wave of Covid is startling for the people here.

**How is dealing with Covid in Thailand different than in America? Three things come to mind.**

1) If you get Covid in Thailand then you have to go to a field hospital (aka a detention center for people with Covid). Parents and children are separated during this time. Since no one is legally allowed to recover at home and parents being separated from their children is a horrendous thought, understandably the anxiety about getting Covid is high among nationals here.



2) There is a 20,000 THB (\$640) fine if you leave your house without a mask, so you can't go on a walk or bike ride (even in our high 90s heat) without wearing a mask. We're not allowed to enter any public places without wearing a mask and before entering any buildings (such as grocery stores) we must have our temperature taken. There is no debate or discussion about whether we should wear masks – everyone does it. Period. The End.

3) There's no vaccine for the general public right now. We can't sign our names on a list to get a vaccine soon so there's no debate about: Should we get a vaccine? Which one? Where's it the cheapest? It's just not available right now.




