Cancer Treatments



Praise the Lord this month Greg completed his 2nd and 3rd intense chemotherapy treatments! His 4th (and final!) 5 day intense chemotherapy round will be December 15-19 followed by two injections on December 22 and 29. These past 2 rounds have gone better than the 1st time because Greg had white cell booster shots in the days following his treatments which helped him avoid the extremely low white blood cell complications he had in October. His white blood cells are still not consistently remaining at a healthy level, so please continue to be praying for the chemotherapy to do its job of destroying the cancer cells but

that it won't harm Greg's white blood cells and that Greg won't get sick. Greg's also developed some blisters on his hands as a result of the chemotherapy treatments so please pray for those to heal.

Each time Greg went into the hospital to stay for 5 days, we covered his walls with pictures from the kids and Bible verses. The Thai nurses and doctors loved it - often taking pictures and expressing how wonderful and cheery it was. We're praying they see our hope amidst this hardship and that maybe even through these verses they will seek out the God of all Comfort. Please pray for gospel seeds to be planted among the hospital workers we are interacting with as we go through this cancer treatment process so that they might receive the most special gift of all - a personal relationship with Jesus Christ.

Computer and Sewing Machine Gifts

This month we were able to give two very special gifts. First, we gave a little girl a computer for school. We are friends with a single mom named Yupin who has two daughters, Praewa, who is 10 years old, and Air, who is 8 years old and severely disabled due to having contracted Japanese Encephalitis as a baby. Yupin works so hard to provide for her two girls, but money is always tight. As schools are still online due to Covid in Thailand, it was really hard for her oldest daughter, Praewa, to do her homework using only her mom's phone so we refurbished and gave her one of our kid's old chromebooks. The joy she experienced was overwhelming. Yupin said,

By the grace of God and by the loving kindness of two sisters I will be able to make some clothes now. Though I will not be making big amount of money by sewing, I hope God will bless the work of my hands."

Greg's staying tucked away during youth group events since he has to be cautious not to get sick due to his chemotherapy treatments, so please pray for his heart as he misses being with the teens and they all miss having him with them too!

Learning Pod



September - November every Monday we hosted 4 other missionary homeschooled families in our home for a Learning Pod. Due to Covid restrictions our normal Co-Op (which is normally around 140 people) couldn't meet, so this was a fun alternative. The little ones had a drama class, which they concluded with a Thanksgiving play in our living room, and Rachel taught the little ones a Messy Art class which included papier mache, finger painting, oil pastels, play-doh, and more. The big kids learned how to use 3D Pens, made "Thailand Life" journals using Canva, and learned some creative evangelism tools. We are so grateful for the special gift of time with these sweet friends every Monday this past semester!

Christmas Outreaches

This month we have several Christmas outreaches planned. We'll be making homemade Christmas cards and sugar cookies with our youth group teens for 60 residents at a local nursing home which will include a note sharing the hope of Jesus Christ. We'll be purchasing and wrapping gifts for 35 children from a poor neighborhood which will include a card sharing the gospel. We'll also be hosting a Christmas party for some of our kids' friends to bless these third culture kids during the holidays. Please pray for each special Christmas gift we hand out this year to plant gospel seeds as people hear about Jesus Christ who loved them so much that He came to earth as a baby and ultimately died on the cross so they can have eternal life.
